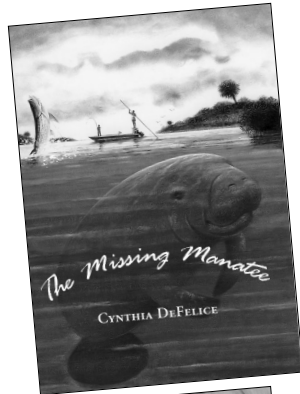

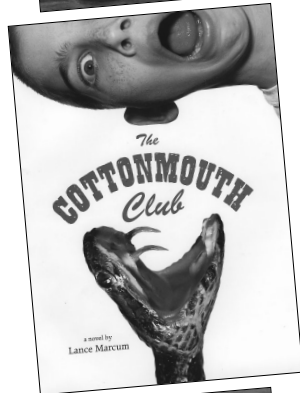

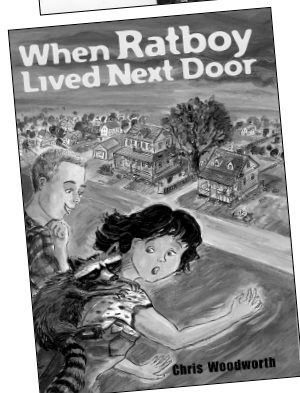
WHEN RATBOY LIVED NEXT DOOR
